Highly Motivated Virginians Encouraged to Apply

Individuals who want to develop or strengthen their advocacy and leadership skills are encouraged to apply. Partners are chosen through a competitive application process administered statewide. If accepted, attendance is required in seven training sessions (September, 2019-April, 2020). There are no costs to participate in the program.

Eligiblity

People with developmental disabilities (DD) and/or parents of young children with DD are eligible to apply for PIP.

Benefits

- Get connected, speak up, educate and communicate on inclusion, quality of education, accesible housing, and supported employment for people with DD.
- Build positive relationships with families, schools, employers, elected officials.
- Learn how to impact local, state, and national policies through advocacy and awareness.
- Improve the lives of people with DD in your local community and across Virginia.
- Understand the strategies used to support people with DD in their own homes across a life span.
